The True North Values of Integrity, Empathy, Cooperation, Respect and Responsibility can be articulated by all stakeholders in the school including students and guide the school in providing a reference point for decisions and actions. The Hamilton North Primary School mantra is that "Everybody is Responsible for Every Child". Staff work closely as a team to support students to reach their potential and achieve the goals of the school.	The school is situated in a semi- rural setting on the outskirts of Hamilton. The school is set in gardens and grounds which have areas for active and passive play. The school has a strongly positive culture that provides a sound basis from where the school can work to improve student learning outcomes, particularly in Literacy and Numeracy.  In 2017 the school enrolment is 294 students and demographic data indicates this may decline over the Strategic Plan period  Key challenges for the school are in the areas of student achievement. For some years the school has been performing slightly below State mean levels when the SFOE indicates the school should be closely matching State levels. The school has a strongly positive culture that provides a sound basis from where the school can work to improve student learning outcomes, particularly in Literacy and Numeracy.	The focus for our school is to improve the learning outcomes across all curriculum areas with a particular focus on Literacy and Numeracy. High quality, consistent instruction across the school will be a priority over the next Strategic Plan period. Our school will develop an evidence based pedagogical model accompanied by researched based instructional practices and high impact teaching strategies to significantly increase the likelihood of consistent teaching and learning and improved student outcomes.
